Two RYDA sponsors, Toyota and Bridgestone, presented an award to Emerson for their wonderful support of RYDA over many years for their special needs students, many of whom would never be able to drive a vehicle. After a busy program presented to the students, Wendy and the members from Forest Hill RC felt that by the end of the day the 120 students had many tips on how to be more aware and respectful to other drivers on our roads.

Shine On Award Presented at RYDA

Maroondah and Forest Hill clubs had nominated one of the RYDA presenters, Anat B for a Rotary Shine On award in 2020 which was deferred due to Covid. Unable to personally attend the recent awards at Templestowe a formal presentation was made to her at the end of the RYDA day. Anat was recognised for the many years she has graphically told the assembled students her story of driving tired and distracted and swerving to miss a dog. She crashed into a pole

ending up in hospital for three months then had extensive rehab leaving her with life changing brain and physical disabilities Her life in 2004 as a bright, young lady in her 20's speaking four languages, playing various instruments, and travelling extensively suddenly changed to now, depending on a walker and carers to assist her everyday needs. A truly amazing lady who has agonisingly showed thousands of students over the years the possible outcome of driving tired and distracted.
