Latest on Coonabarabran

You will recall that in 2018 our Club purchased \$3,000+ of gift vouchers to give to the farmers in the Coonabarabran area who had been in the middle of the terrible drought being experienced by central and western NSW. Roger and Pam travelled to Coonabarabran on behalf of the Club and handed these vouchers out to the community members to purchase things they may have been doing without or were unable to afford.

Roger and Pam recently passed through Coonabarabran on their road trip to SE Queensland. We are pleased to report to the Club that the countryside has had lots of rain recently and it is looking so much better than when they travelled there in 2018. There is now water flowing in the Castlereagh River that runs through Coonabarabran which was a dry riverbed in 2018, the dams are all full, the paddocks are green, they are going to have a bumper wheat crop this year and they have even planted seedlings on the traffic islands in the middle of the main street. It was very pleasing to see such a vast difference in the countryside and town again.
